July is here, a heat wave is near...



Please stay safe in the sun throughout the summer.

Most of us welcome hot weather, but when it is too hot for too long, there are health risks. In England, there are on average 2000 heat related deaths every year. As the hot weather hits this summer, make sure it does not harm you or anyone you know.

The main risks posed by a heatwave are:

Not drinking enough water, over heating which can make symptoms worse for people who already have problems with their heart or breathing. Heat exhaustion and sunstroke.

Tips for coping in hot weather are:

- look out for those who may struggle to keep themselves cool and hydrated older people, those with underlying health conditions and those who live alone are particularly at risk
- stay cool indoors many of us will need to stay safe at home this summer so know how to keep your home cool
- close curtains on rooms that face the sun to keep indoor spaces cooler and remember it may be cooler outdoors than indoors
- drink plenty of fluids and avoid excess alcohol
- never leave anyone in a closed, parked vehicle, especially infants, young children, or animals
- try to keep out of the sun between 11am to 4pm
- walk in the shade, apply sunscreen regularly and wear a hat, if you have to go out in the heat
- avoid exercising in the hottest parts of the day
- make sure you take water with you if you are travelling
- if you are going into open water to cool down, take care and follow local safety advice
